

Community for ALL (C4A) Poster Instructions

The C4A poster is a great way to engage your community and give inclusion and acceptance the spotlight for discussion. We highly suggest you create a poster as a group art project and encourage you to involve all ages for a creative and motivating community awareness project.

1. Obtain a large foam poster board (standard sizes: 8' x 4', 60" x 40", 48" x 36" and 40"x 32) The size of the board is determined by the number of participants. We used the largest as we anticipated 60 pieces. To determine foam core size, two puzzle pieces together are about 8 inches across and 7 inches high. Multiple this by number of artists. Boards are easy to cut down if needed.
2. Purchase "people" puzzle pieces. You can order online for a very reasonable price. [Puzzle Pieces](#)
3. Prep the foam poster board by drawing a border all the way around the edge then hand draw or paste a printed the C4A logo (see Marketing Materials packet) on the top of the board. You can also add a logo from your organization somewhere on the poster as well.
4. Continue prep by tracing an outline in light pencil of the people puzzle pieces. Begin at the bottom and work your way straight across and then add more rows in a pyramid shape. (This will make pasting these in place much easier)
5. The puzzle pieces are meant to be self portraits. the instructor should begin by explaining that the eye level line is in the center of the face. Emphasize skin, eye, and hair color as well as drawing the artist's favorite outfit. Colored pencils work well for this and bright colors can be achieved when pressure is applied during application. Have group leader paste the finished puzzle pieces in place on the foam poster board and place in prominent location for all to see! Use a clear glue with a brush and start in the center at the bottom and work your way to the sides and then up.

We highly suggest that your Community for ALL Poster project be part of a lesson on inclusion and the importance of everyone being part of the community.
